## Personal Teaching Philosophy and Commitment to Excellence in Education By Leonardo Zuno

## **Statement on education:**

Education is everyone's right and should have as its primary aim the transformation of the person and by extension, of the culture. Learning is much more than the exchange of facts, but reaches much deeper into the human quest to be faithful stewards of the created order by desiring to know more about it through education. A good educator lights a fire of awe into the hearts and minds of students: 1) awe for the transformation that happens between not knowing something and finally knowing the very same thing that once was unknown; 2) the awe of deepening of knowledge in an area that one already knew about; and finally, 3) the awe of finding ways to apply theoretical knowledge into practice for the common good.

As an educator, I can best express my teaching philosophy by the commitments I make: -Student-centered instruction, where the classroom environment promotes equity, excellence, and learning, where expectations, rules, and procedures are clearly communicated.

- -I will always *display professionalism in every task*, however large or small it may be. I will always aim to be 'advanced competent' and even 'proficient' at all areas of my teaching.
- -My students will learn with *college readiness* in mind, knowing that the future is what they make of it... *starting now!*
- -I will always use of helpful teaching strategies, including the ones that I, *a professional thief of good ideas*, have learned from master teachers.
- -I myself will abide by the class rules, because they are *'our rules'*: Timeliness, Trust and respect, Team-players... all of us, Take responsibility, Truthfulness and honesty.
- -I will keep up with the research and *face the facts* that will make me a better teacher and my students more motivated independent learners.
- -I will *keep my students' minds excited* with novelty, intensive learning, constant movement, relevant topics, and an emotional personal connection to the subject being taught.
- -I will address my students' short- and long-term memories and will give them creative ways to *retrieve the information* learned in class. My students will become *professional problem-solvers* by facing them with challenges relevant to the subject matter.
- -I will always operate under *a vision of students as life-long learners* with great skills in problem-solving and critical thinking.
- -I will search for the **Zone of Proximal Development** that challenges students. I will create a *cultural/communal context* for learning and cooperation among peers, and by means of *scaffolding*, will gradually turn things over to students. –Mr. Lev Vygotsky gets credit for these ideas!

- -I will *bridge* previously-learned material with new content and will challenge students with *inductive reasoning and critical thinking skills*.
- -I will keep in mind my *students' diversity*, including the diversity of their *multiple intelligences* and all that it entails for my own teaching approach... there will always be some activity that will *engage students on their level*.
- -I will teach general topics and will *address the particulars/specifics* once students *first understand the big picture*. Especially with the little ones, I will teach using *concrete* examples and models and move *toward the abstract*, higher-order thinking activities as they mature.
- -I will *establish a culture of learning*, good student/teacher rapport, effective procedures, and fair rules for the good of all, with an organized physical space and a very positive and encouraging mental set.
- -High expectations will always be the constant norm, and students will know how much I care about their success... because as I've heard: 'Nobody cares how much you know until they know how much you care.'
- -I will be kind, professional, strict, and fun *all at once* -- and will do my best to always *keep my 'with-it-ness' sharp at all times* while maintaining emotional objectivity and treating every student with the same respect that is due to his or her human dignity.
- -I will always use thorough cycles of instruction, ensuring that I am not only teaching until I am blue in the face, but that my students are actually learning and that they can demonstrate it.
- -I am committed to all of the above ways of <u>showing excellence</u> in the classroom, because this –I firmly believe—is good education!
